Critical Points to Consider

- All Oil & Gas work is considered HIGH HAZARD work in BC, AB & SK.
- Entry level first aid training is considered less than 20 hours of instruction and would include Emergency First aid, Standard First Aid, Class A (SK), and Level 1 (BC), and Level 1 (BC Standard First Aid).
- Advanced first aid training is any first aid training that exceeds the above mentioned courses.

Steps to Follow

- Step 1 In which province is your worksite? SK go to Table 1, AB - go to Table 2, BC - go to Table 3.
- Step 2 How many workers on the site?
- **Step 3** How far is the site from a hospital?
- **Step 4** What province is the worker coming from?
- **Step 5** Follow the appropriate chart to identify your first aid requirements.

The BC / Alberta Process

The process for employers to have out-of-jurisdiction first aid certificates recognized between BC & AB is as follows:

- Provinces will recognize certain out-of-jurisdiction first aid certificates.
- All First Aiders are required to know the applicable first aid regulations for the jurisdiction in which they are working.
- In BC the employee must present the certificate(s) to an approved first aid training agency for review.
- The agency in BC will then verify the employee's identity and that the certificate is still valid.
- The agency in BC will then provide the employee with a "jurisprudence" package that describes the first aid regulations in BC for the province for the individual to review.
- The agency in BC will then issue an out-of-jurisdiction certificate – there may be a fee.
