KEY INITIATIVES

Human and Organizational Performance (HOP) Community of Practice

The fifth HOP meeting was held on June 2 with guest presenter Dr. Martha Acosta presenting on Complex Adaptive Systems.

The group will break over the summer and resume meetings in September.

Canadian Chapter of DROPS

Energy Safety Canada has established a Canadian Chapter of <u>DropsOnline.org</u>. This community of practice meets regularly to facilitate the ongoing advancement of the prevention of dropped objects throughout industry. Drilling & Completions Committee (DACC)

IRP 2: Completing and Servicing Sour Wells

<u>IRP 2</u> is available for industry review until July 7, 2021. The IRP provides practices for the safe planning, equipment and fluid handling for completions and servicing operations on sour wells using a service rig.

IRP 20: Wellsite Design Spacing Requirements

In collaboration with provincial regulators, a workplan is being developed to address spacing considerations for simultaneous operations.

IRP 21: Coiled Tubing Operations

IRP 21 is approved for a final industry review.

IRP 28: Drilling and Completions Waste Management

IRP 28 is available for industry review until July 7, 2021. The IRP provides an overview of industry recommendations for waste management options for the oil and gas sector.

IRP 29: Temporary Pipework, Securement and Restraint

Working groups are validating the definition of temporary pipework and a risk register is being developed to provide risk/consideration/mitigation information by service.

IRP 30: Temporary Wellbore Suspension (New)

A call for volunteers will be issued in August to work on the Temporary Wellbores Suspension IRP. The intent of the IRP is to ensure wellbores are safe and secure, integrity is preserved, and equipment is maintained to allow for efficient re-activation or permanent wellbore decommissioning.



REGIONAL UPDATES

Oil Sands

The Oil Sands Safety Committee welcomed new members from ConocoPhillips and Imperial Oil. Ongoing projects are Get a Grip program, Driving in the Mine Guideline and Tailings Safety Guideline. A radio ad campaign on heat stress and stroke is running in time for summer.

British Columbia

The Q2 meeting of the Advisory Committee and AGM was held, 9 meetings with employers have been completed, 5 meetings with regional Authorized Training Providers completed, 3 new producers joined the Prime Contractor Roundtable.

Saskatchewan

The Q2 Advisory Committee was held, 23 meetings have been completed with employers who are in a WCB surcharge position, preplanning for 2022 Business Plan and WCB budget submission.



DATA & ANALYTICS

Did you know when a young worker is injured, it's usually a *Struck by Object*, *Caught In or Compressed by Equipment or Object* injury?

As workers get older, those kinds of injuries are less common, but their risks of *Overexertion* and *Bodily Reaction* go up.

The <u>Industry Growth and Worker Injury by Age</u> <u>Groups</u> report also highlights:

- Overall claim rate went down significantly in 2020. This is especially true among young workers.
- Change in employment numbers is linked to injury claim rate.
- Workers are at greatest risk of Fall on Same Level injuries at the end of their careers.
